MAINTAINING HEALTH AND SAFETY









- Unless mandated by a government entity, facial coverings will be optional for students, faculty, staff and visitors.
- Classroom and common spaces will return to pre-COVID configurations and procedures.
- Athens City Schools will partner with parents in educating students on the importance of thorough hand washing and hygiene.
- Hand sanitizer will be provided throughout the buildings.
- School custodial staff will continue to clean and disinfect classrooms, bathrooms, cafeterias, and other high traffic areas using recommended sanitizing supplies.
- Parents should monitor children at home for fever and COVID-19 symptoms (please see the CDC list of symptoms).
- In the event students begin to show symptoms of COVID-19 while at school, they will be sent to a quarantine area until a parent picks them up.
- Students with a fever of 100.4 or greater should not come to school, and must be fever free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications before returning to school.
- Teachers and staff who have symptoms should stay home and refer to their healthcare provider for testing and care.
- The Superintendent (or designee) will develop, and amend as necessary, procedures based on current guidance from local and state government and health officials.
- Athens City Schools will collaborate with local health officials to provide information related to free vaccination clinics as well as free COVID-19 testing sites.
- Appropriate accommodations for students and staff with disabilities will be made in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and other pertinent laws and safety policies.
- Food services will return to pre-COVID routines.
- Refillable water bottles are encouraged as some water fountains will be unavailable.



CONTINUITY OF SERVICES

- Students will attend school five days a week for in-person, face-to-face instruction at our traditional schools. Remote learning will not be offered at these schools.
- Students desiring remote learning must apply to Athens Renaissance School. Enrollment is not guaranteed.
- Athens City Schools will work diligently to provide after-school and summer services to ensure students have opportunities to master any standards they may have missed.
- Social emotional learning activities will be connected to the ACS Portrait of a Graduate.
- Grade level and content area meetings will be held in schools to look at student work and other data to assess the academic needs of students and adjust instruction.
- Professional learning opportunities will be provided that focus on the whole individual to empower students for success now and in the future.
- Students in PK-5th will have access to devices in every classroom.
- Students in grades 6th 12th will have the opportunity to secure an iPad to utilize during school and at home.

COMMUNICATIONS

- The ACS In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Service Plan will be posted on the Athens City Schools District Website and communicated to students, staff, parents and the community via email, text, and social media.
- The ACS In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Service Plan will be reviewed every three months by the ILT to ensure it remains relevant and meets regulatory requirements. Revisions will be made as necessary.
- Public comment was sought and taken into consideration.
- The ACS In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Service Plan is provided in an understandable and universal format. This document can be provided in an alternative format as requested.
